

Step 1: 'Were' or 'Was' and 'Did' or 'Done'

Both 'was' and 'were' are past tense, but they are different.

Was is used in first person, when you are talking about yourself and using 'I' – **I was doing work**. It can also be used for third person if there is only one person – **He was, She was, It was**

Were is used in the second person when you are talking about another person – **You were, Yours were**. It can also be used in third person where there is more than one person – **We were, they were**
