We have had a busy start to the new school year with lots of learning and fun throughout the school. We have already enjoyed a Victorian Day, a trip to Fishbourne and the Anne of Cleves House, a visit from the Toy museum, a Harvest assembly and various sporting events! Throughout the school the children have settled extremely well into their new classes. It has been lovely watching the new Reception children (Red Rabbits) settle in. They have made an impressive start and after only a few weeks at school were confident enough to join the rest of the school on the field at lunchtimes.

This term we have successfully introduced our school 'Dojo's' as a system for rewarding key learning strengths. The children have been overwhelmingly positive about the Dojo's and we are looking forward to explaining more about them to parents after their class's Friday assembly in the coming terms. .

It was great to see parents at our coffee mornings for each class and we had nearly 100% attendance at our parent teacher meetings (there are just a few families left to see). At our Friday 'tea parties' the children in Years 3-6 have told me that they feel coming to the parent consultations helps them with their learning and how they like hearing what their teacher has to say about them. Parents at our Parents Forum have also said how helpful it is although they, and the teachers, would like longer time slots so things are less rushed—we just need 25 hours in every day! Without such positive partnership between home and school the children certainly wouldn't be making the progress they are now. Thank you for your ongoing support.

In 2014 Ofsted rated 64 per cent of primary schools in East Sussex as good or outstanding. In 2017 its 91 per cent and we want the Government to give us a long-term funding plan to maintain that success. 

E-Safety

Gaming Devices

The UK Safer Internet Centre (www.saferinternet.org.uk) has some excellent advice for how to keep children safe online.

Gaming devices provide a variety of interesting activities and ways for young people to engage with their friends and families. However, it is important to be aware of what these devices can do and how you can talk with your child to help them to use this technology in safe and positive way. All modern gaming devices offer parental controls to help you manage how your child uses their device, but these do need to be set up in order for them to be operational.




Three steps for parents:

- 1) Understand the capabilities of gaming devices and how you as a parent can support your child to be smart and safe in their gaming.
- 2) Find out about the parental controls available - it helps if you are the one to set up the gaming device so you are in control of these. Gaming devices have parental controls to help parents manage their children's gaming, for example, to prevent internet browsing or restrict access to age-restricted games. Find out about [PEGI age ratings](#) to help you decide which games are appropriate for your child's age.
- 3) Talk with your child about safe and responsible gaming and agree a set of family rules. Perhaps you could agree rules with your child about how long they are allowed to play for, how they should behave towards other gamers and agree rules about not meeting up with people they have only met online. Remember that gaming devices like the Xbox 360, Wii and PSP connect to the internet, so the same advice and rules for keeping safe online apply.

Nursery: Starting earlier...the term after they're two?

We are looking into whether there are any families who would consider sending their child to nursery earlier than our current system of 'after their third birthday'.

Lunchtime Club

At the Parent's Forum there was a question about our Lunchtime Club (Sarah's Club). Children go to the club for a variety of reasons including: they are finding play-time a bit daunting, they have had issues on the playground or with friends, they benefit from some quiet time or 'checking in' with an adult before going out to play or they may want to speak to an adult for a bit. Children can either ask to go to the club or will be asked to go. There may be times when there isn't enough space on a particular day so they can book a place. The aim is always that attendance at the club is a temporary measure and that with support and guidance children will be able to enjoy being outside at lunchtime playing with their friends.

From this term, Sarah will contact you if your child has been asked to attend the club and inform you why that is the case.
