Safety Notice – Woodways Zebra Crossing

Now that the days are becoming brighter the sunshine can cause a glare for drivers on our roads. Please can we ask you to take extra care when crossing and walking by the roadside.

We have been made aware that drivers have experienced some pedestrians, and mainly the bigger people, not following the guidance for using a zebra crossing. Some grown ups have been seen walking off the pavement in a diagonal line to cross at the zebra crossing and do not seem to be looking properly before stepping into the road.

Our school staff car park is in constant use and we are aware that the entrance crosses the pavement where many people walk to school. Please take extra care when crossing the entrance to our school staff car park where vehicles are turning and crossing the pavement.

The Highway Code rules for when using any type of crossing you should:

- always check that the traffic has stopped before you start to cross or push a pram onto the crossing
- always cross between the studs or over the zebra markings, do not cross at the side of the crossing or on the zigzag lines, as it can be dangerous

You **MUST NOT** loiter on any type of crossing.

Give traffic plenty of time to see you and to stop before you cross. Vehicles will need more time when the road is slippery. Wait until traffic has stopped from both directions or the road is clear before crossing. Remember that traffic does not have to stop until someone has moved onto the crossing. Keep looking both ways, and listening, in case a driver or rider has not seen you and attempts to overtake a vehicle that has stopped.
