

# MITHIAN SCHOOL BEHAVIOUR POLICY

## Aims

- Children are to understand that self control, respect and consideration are the basis of the code of conduct at Mithian School.
- Children will understand what constitutes acceptable and unacceptable behaviour.
- Children will understand what sanctions may be imposed for unacceptable behaviour.
- Children are to be rewarded for good behaviour and good work.

## Implementation

1. At the start of each academic year, in discussion with the class teacher, children will discuss a list of desirable and undesirable forms of behaviour.
2. These are linked to the School's Golden Rules.
3. Golden Rules will be displayed in each classroom and elsewhere around the School.
4. Wearing the school uniform implies a readiness for the discipline of the school and encourages the child to approach school in the right frame of mind. As such it should be encouraged.
5. Disruptive behaviour will be dealt with by a) giving a warning and b) removing golden time/stamp as appropriate.
6. Repeated disruptive behaviour will be referred to the Headteacher.
7. Continued disruptive behaviour will be referred to parents as and when appropriate. County guidelines will be followed for exclusions.
8. Teachers are encouraged to use positive reinforcement of good behaviour as often as possible.
9. A reward system is an important positive part of any discipline policy. Here at Mithian rewards take two forms:
  - Stickers will be given out for good work, extra effort and good behaviour. Children are encouraged to reach a target number of stickers to earn an extra reward.
  - Special pupil award weekly in each class – photo of special award in corridor and album in entrance.

**Foundation and KS1** - Daily Golden Time (5 mins). This is a regular special time as reward for that day; the time can be removed but the children start afresh the next day.

**KS2** - One enrichment afternoon, per half term. This idea came from the children via the school council. A range of activities are on offer to those who make it to the 'rainbow'. The children sign up for the activities they would like to do. Children may miss some of the afternoon due to sanctions, they may take part in some of the activities, depending on how much is lost.
