






Thank you to all our families who completed the remote learning survey and for your comments and responses about our remote learning offer and provision. We had 151 responses in total; we have compiled the results and are pleased to present them to you.

The results are being discussed with staff and governors so that we can refine our offer in the coming weeks and support our children and school community as best we can during these challenging times. Suggestions and feedback from our school community is an important part of school improvement and by sharing your views you will help set our school development priorities for the future.

Thank you for your comments. In response to your comments senior leaders and teachers have already begun to make changes and reasonable adjustments to the remote learning offer including:

- Increased live learning sessions using MS Teams.
- Increased levels of pre-recorded teacher inputs.
- More varied maths tasks and inputs.
- Increased small group and individual session for pupils.
- Increased level of verbal feedback where it serves to challenge and/ or support learners.
- Increased levels of variety and challenge in English lessons.
- Improved levels of staff confidence when using MS Teams.
- Teachers ensuring that children and parents are aware of how to contact them for help and support where needed.
- Additional challenge tasks provided in maths.
- KS2 mindfulness/ well-being sessions and whole school 'big sit together'.
