Dear Parents/Carers,

We have been made aware that a member of our school community has tested positive for coronavirus. The child in question has been absent from school for at least one week and developed symptoms long after they were last in school. Following consultation with Public Health and the family it has been confirmed that no class bubbles will need to close as the child has not been in contact with other members of the school community for at least one week. School will be open to all pupils as normal on Monday.

Again, I must say that this family have acted appropriately and accordingly in line with guidance and all procedures and school has worked alongside Public Health and the Local Authority as soon as confirmation was provided to school today. Apologies for not getting this information earlier however we are guided by Public Health and the information and analysis process can take time but is necessary to be completed so that you all have the correct information and the appropriate decisions can be made.

I appreciate families may be concerned but we are continuing to monitor the situation and are working closely with Public Health. This letter is to inform you of the current situation and provide advice on how to support your child. Please be assured that for most people, coronavirus will be a mild illness. Providing that your child remains well, they should attend school as normal each day. We will keep this under constant review.

What to do if you child develops symptoms of COVID-19

If your child develops symptoms, they should remain at home for at least 10 days from the date when their symptoms appeared as advised in:

You should arrange testing for your child via:

All other household members who remain well must stay at home and not leave the house for 14 days. The 14 day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill.



Household member should not go to work, school or public areas and exercise should be taken within the home. Household members staying at home for 14 days will greatly reduce the overall amount of infection the household could pass on to others in the community. If you are able, move any vulnerable individuals (e.g. the elderly or those with underlying health conditions) out of your home to stay with family or friends for the duration of the home isolation period.

Symptoms of COVID-19

The most common symptoms of coronavirus are the recent onset of:

- A new, continuous cough
- A high temperature
- A loss of or change in normal sense of taste and smell

For most people, coronavirus will be a mild illness. If your child does develop any symptoms, you can seek advice from NHS 111 at <https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/check-if-you-have-coronavirus-symptoms-or-by-phoning-111>.

How to stop COVID-19 spreading

There are things we can all do to help reduce the risk of any of us or the people we live with getting ill with coronavirus:

- Wash your hands with soap and water often – do this for at least 20 seconds
- Use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- Wash your hands as soon as you get home
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve when coughing or sneezing – do not use your hand
- Put tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards
