As of September, all pupils must wear sensible black, waterproof shoes for school. Trainers are not to be worn as they are not part of school uniform – they must only be worn for PE.</p> <p>Next year, pupils in Years 1-6 are to wear their PE kit into school on the day that they have their PE lesson. Pupils must wear a white t-shirt, dark shorts and pumps or trainers.
