

Parentpay Payments

Thank you to everyone who keeps their accounts topped up and pays for trips promptly. There is a lot of administration behind the scenes and this helps us to keep the trips running smoothly. All of the permissions for trips, emergency contact details and medical information are collected through Parentpay. This information is essential for a child to be able to go on a trip and we need it in sufficient time to ensure the documentation is up-to-date for the trip pack. We aim to produce the trip pack a number of days before the trip but this is not possible if we are still waiting for information to be completed.

If you have difficulties in paying for a trip, please let us know by contacting the office.

If payments aren't made for trips, lunches or snacks, the money has to come from the school budget and, as you know, our budgets are under a lot of pressure so please help us by paying promptly.

PFA Quiz Night
