## Attendance Matters

Since the beginning of term we have been really pleased with the number of children who have 100% attendance. However, there are still too many children under 95%.

Attending school regularly and arriving on time is key to supporting your child in their learning. The Government expects children to be in school every day unless they are very unwell. Once registration has closed late arrival at school without permission will be recorded as an unauthorised late. The Head Teacher can only authorise absence in term time for **EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES**.

### What should you do if your child is ill?

Please contact the school before 9.00 to tell us why your child is absent. The school office opens at 8.30 but you can leave a message on the answer phone before this. If you do not tell us why your child is absent this is marked as 'unauthorised absence.' Should the absence be recurring we may ask for medical proof.

### St John's unauthorised attendance process

#### 1 Unauthorised Session

Call or text home to establish why your child is absent. A letter will be sent reminding parent/carer to notify school when child is absent.

#### 6 Unauthorised Sessions

A member of our Team will arrange an appointment to establish why your child is absent.

#### 10 or more Unauthorised Session

A **Penalty Warning Notice** will be requested. Each Penalty Notice fine is £60 if paid within 21 days of the date of posting and £120 if paid after this but within 28 days of the date of posting.

10 days of absence during the school year causes your attendance figure to drop below **95%. Aim for 100%** attendance.

## Bicycles and Scooters

Please ensure your children dismount from their bicycles and scooters before entering the school grounds. I have noticed a number of children riding into the playground before and after school. This must stop immediately for the safety of all our children.

It is imperative that all children who come to school on their bike or scooter wear a helmet, for their own safety.

## Car Park

As you will be aware, we have been closing the main car park gates at 08.25 and 15.00hrs daily. This has immediately eliminated the problems that we have been having with cars and vans driving through the school car park. Please remember that access to the office will be via the new pedestrian entrance Grove Road then left across the car park until the new reception area is completed.
