<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Children will enter classrooms and follow class rules for start of the school day e.g. sitting on the carpet or at tables ready for the class register</li> <li>When transition to start an activity children are expected to walk quietly and be ready for the activity promptly.</li> <li>Class adults will be prepared for class activities/lessons... ready for whole class input</li> <li>Additional adults will support pupils as directed by the class teacher</li> <li>All adults to insist on children following of the classroom behaviour school expectations by all children and to intervene when this is not happening</li> <li>Children should not be in classes without adult supervision</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Children &amp; adults moving around the school are expected to walk at all times with minimal talking respecting that others are still working</li> <li>Voices by children and adults will not be raised</li> <li>All adults are responsible for having high expectations of pupils' behaviour and will model this in how they move around school</li> <li>When walking up and down the stairs children will walk on the left hand side</li> <li>All adults to insist on children following of the walking around school expectations by all children and to intervene when this is not happening</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Children will walk into the hall in their class/house group line quietly in an orderly manner</li> <li>Adults supervising the movement of children into the hall will use minimal talking/preferably a sign for no talking - when reminding children to remain quiet</li> <li>Children are expected to sit in their class row/house row quietly</li> <li>Children will remain quiet throughout the assembly and can use the 'talk sign' if they are asked a question</li> <li>All adults to insist on children following of the assembly behaviour school expectations by all children and to intervene when this is not happening without using raised voices</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Children will enter the hall when it is their class's lunch time walking quietly in an orderly manner using the hall door from the reception hallway</li> <li>Children will line up at the dinner counter and follow the direction of adults supervising lunch</li> <li>Children will remain seated at all times while eating their lunch and be encouraged to use good table manners: correct use of knife and fork; not speaking with a full mouth etc.</li> <li>Children will remove coats/hats while eating</li> <li>Children will walk when moving around the hall to take their used plates/dishes to get rid of waste/stack plates/collect their 2<sup>nd</sup> course</li> <li>All adults to insist on children following of the lunch hall behaviour school expectations by all children and to intervene when this is not happening without using raised voices</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Children to walk into the playground along the walk way adjacent to the hall</li> <li>Children will enter the playground and not return to the school building unless they request to do so from an adult</li> <li>When classes are called from the playground to the hall for their lunch, children will walk down the walkway next to the hall before entering the building</li> <li>When the bell is rung at the end of lunch time children will line up quietly in their class lines ready to enter the building with their class teacher/adults</li> <li>Adults will be prompt to collect the children at 1pm at the end of lunch</li> <li>Adults on lunch duty will be prompt when undertaking their lunch duty</li> </ul>
<p>All children are expected to wear the correct school uniform. The only acceptable jewellery is stud earrings, which will be covered with tape during PE.</p>
