Primary PE and Sport Premium Funding 2018-19

All pupils leaving primary school **physically literate** and with the **knowledge, skills and motivation** necessary to equip them for a **healthy, active lifestyle** and **lifelong participation** in physical activity and sport.

Schools need to make sure that the funding is spent to promote a healthy lifestyle and to improve the quality of PE and sport in schools.

We look to see an improvement against the following key indicators:

- The engagement of **all** pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
- The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- Increased participation in competitive sport.

For this academic year 2017/18 we received **£17,390** in funding, was spent in the following ways:

Lunchtime activities: We have extended our lunchtime games leader program so that they are now on site 5 days a week; they provide structured exercise and games activities across KS1 & KS2 age groups.

Local sports associations: We are fortunate to have trained coaches from TGS and District Sports supporting the delivery of PE sessions for all year groups from Foundation to Year 6.

After school provision: We decided to provide an after school, Multi skills Club, Dance Club and Basketball Club both for infants and juniors. This has been enthusiastically taken up. We also have an after school football club, culminating in a tournament with local schools, and will be providing an athletics club in the summer term.
