Following a local incident of grooming on ROBLOX, we have been asked to remind you all of the game. It allows children to be contacted by other users whose identity may not always be genuine. Please remain vigilant when children are playing and using APPs, check security and privacy settings and where possible always supervise children.

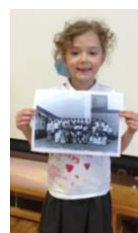


### Early Years
