



## SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

Date of next review: As required

### 1 Rationale

- 1.1 We believe that the wearing of a school uniform enables children to identify with their school, gives a sense of belonging, is practical and smart, reinforces a positive work ethos and reduces expenditure for parents.

### 2 Aims

- 2.1 All children present themselves smartly in correct uniform, feeling proud to belong to the school.  
2.2 Parents share and support the expectations of the school.

### 3 Requirements:

- 3.1 Children need to wear the school uniform each day, including appropriate footwear.  
3.2 Uniform can be purchased from PL Schoolwear in Aylesbury either online or by visiting the shop (details available from office).  
3.3 The school will contact parents to provide uniform for the day should inappropriate clothing be worn (eg unsuitable for the weather, too revealing, offensive/unsuitable slogans, etc).  
3.4 PE kit should be kept in school all week and taken home at weekends for washing.  
3.5 If a child does not have their PE kit in school, parents will be reminded to ensure that kit is provided (children will not borrow kit from others).  
3.6 Parents are asked to clearly label every item of school clothing with their child's name to assist in the return of lost items (unnamed lost property that is left unclaimed will be disposed of termly).  
3.7 Parents should contact the Headteacher if adjustments to the uniform policy are required for medical or religious reasons. All such requests will be considered and outside agency advice sought as appropriate.

### 4 Uniform Specification:

- 4.1 Grey school skirt, trousers or shorts (red check dresses may be worn in the summer term)  
4.2 White polo shirt or white collared shirt / blouse (school ties are optional)  
4.3 Red school sweatshirt or cardigan (school logo or plain)  
4.4 White, grey or black socks / tights  
4.5 Black school shoes - velcro or laced (trainers and boots are not permitted)

### 5 Uniform Specification for Physical Education:

- 5.1 Plain t-shirt in the child's house colour, plain black shorts and football socks (red or black)  
5.2 Trainers (for outdoor games)  
5.3 Tracksuit bottoms/jogging trousers (cold weather only)  
5.4 Sweatshirt/tracksuit jacket (cold weather only)  
5.5 Named PE bag (small bag only to fit in school locker)  
5.6 One piece swimsuit (girls) or close fitting shorts/trunks (boys) with a swim hat; goggles may be worn if parental consent is given (Y5 only)

### 6 Hair, Cosmetics and Jewellery:

- 6.1 Cosmetics, included nail polish, are not to be worn unless the Headteacher has given permission. The office staff will assist in removing nail varnish or make-up should it be worn.  
6.2 A small plain stud may be worn in each ear (children must remove or cover these for PE – parents should provide their child with tape or plasters as required).  
6.3 Hair should be of natural colour and of an even cut (haircuts should not include shaved patterns).  
6.4 Longer hair must be tied up for reasons of health and safety. A plain band or hair tie should be used (black, grey or red). Large clips, pins or elaborate decorations are not acceptable.

### 7 Responsibilities

- 7.1 Parents must ensure that children arrive at school each morning wearing appropriate clean uniform.  
7.2 Children must ensure that they wear their uniform correctly.  
7.3 School staff will ensure that uniform is worn appropriately and discuss any concerns with parents.  
7.4 The school office will return named lost property and store unnamed property for collection by the child/parent.
