

Risk assessment for child wetting.

Parents will be asked to bring into school their child's drawstring bag containing a plastic carrier bag and a complete change of clothes. This will stay on a peg in school.

If a child wets themselves, they can change their clothes and put the wet clothes into the plastic bag to go home.

Risk assessment for child soiling 1.

Parents will be asked to bring into school their child's drawstring bag containing a plastic carrier bag and a complete change of clothes. This will stay on a peg in school.

If a child soils themselves, they can clean themselves and change their clothes and put the soiled clothes into the plastic bag to go home.

Risk assessment for child soiling 2.

Parents will be asked to bring into school their child's drawstring bag containing a plastic carrier bag and a complete change of clothes. This will stay on a peg in school.

If a child soils themselves and they cannot clean themselves, or the soiling is extensive, a member of staff can help the child to clean.

The member of staff must try and maintain a safe distance.

The member of staff must wear gloves, plastic disposable apron and the personalised PPE face protection.

Soiled clothes will be put in a nappy sack and tied and then double bagged in another and tied and then put in the plastic carrier bag to go home.

If soiling is very extensive and school is not able to provide thorough cleaning, parents will be phoned to collect the child to be cleaned at home.
