

**ORCHARD VALE COMMUNITY SCHOOL**  
**SPORTS PREMIUM ACTION PLAN 2019 – 2020**



The school will receive £18,460 and we intend to use it to develop PE and sport in the following ways:

- To see an increased level of progress in PE for all children.
- To see lessons taught across the school be consistent and well assessed.
- To give 100% of children the opportunity to take part in inter/intra school events and competitions and attend as many sporting events as possible offered within the Barnstaple Learning Community.
- To increase the number of children participating/ representing Orchard Vale competitively and in festivals.
- Staff to feel more confident and competent regards the teaching of physical education, including implementation of the New Primary PE Curriculum.
- To meet the swimming curriculum requirements at the end of Year 6.
- To promote health and active lifestyles both within school and beyond.

This year we have an additional carry forward of £4.800 from additional funding received last year and we intend to use it in the following way:

Next steps from last year:

- We will continue to sign up to as many sporting events and activities as possible within the Park and Pilton learning community as well as Ventrus organised events for all Ventrus schools.
- We would like to run our own events at school, such as cross country and football, and invite other local and partner schools to attend.
- The daily mile initiative will continue and KS2 children will restart their marathon journey in September.
- We will continue to attend professional sports events where possible to give children the experience and aspiration of something bigger.
- Swimming intervention was highly successful and by working with parents we were able to target specific children meaning parents who already pay for lessons or attend swimming out of school hours did not have to pay for additional lessons.
- We were able to take both year 6 and 5 for targeted swimming lessons enabling those younger children to access them over 2 years hopefully giving them a better opportunity of achieving the expected standard.
- We will continue to try and resource our lessons to a high level making sure resources are of good quality, plentiful and available.
- We will continue to invest in a high level of rewards and incentives around daily exercise and PE sessions to engage and motivate.
- We are looking at the feasibility and costs around developing our grounds with an accessible track around the field for the daily mile.

**Despite Covid restrictions we will continue to support or local learning community sports agreement as we feel this is a valuable service to the children at OV and we would like to see this service continue. I know they are planning on running many interschool virtual events throughout the year and the sport co-ordinator will be in school providing Covid safe internal school events.**

**We will continue to support swimming although we are aware this may not be possible depending on restrictions.**

**Due to lockdown we will focus heavily on outdoor activity and PE will be a focus across the school. We may need to invest in more equipment so there is enough basic PE equipment for each bubble to prevent sharing or additional cleaning of some items. We will continue to audit our equipment and restock where needed.**
