I sincerely hope you are all keeping safe and well. These strange times are almost beginning to feel like the normal now. Very surreal indeed.

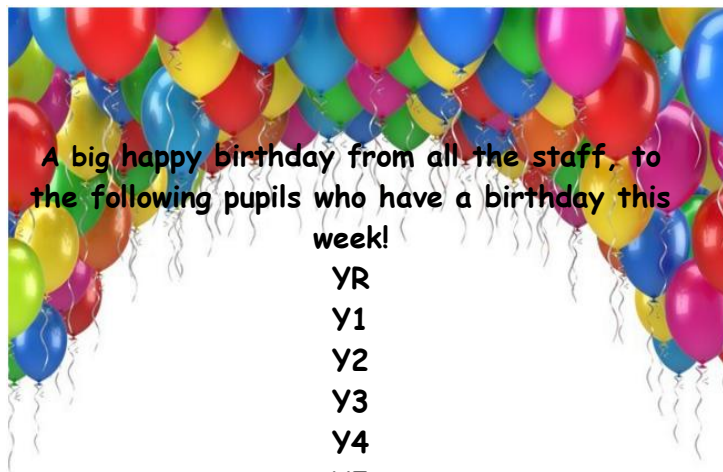

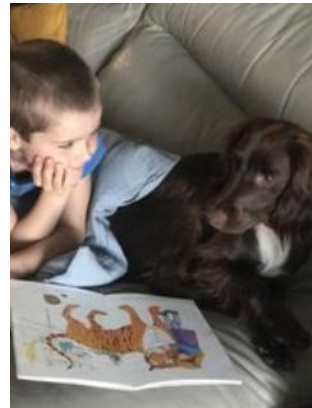

Year 2

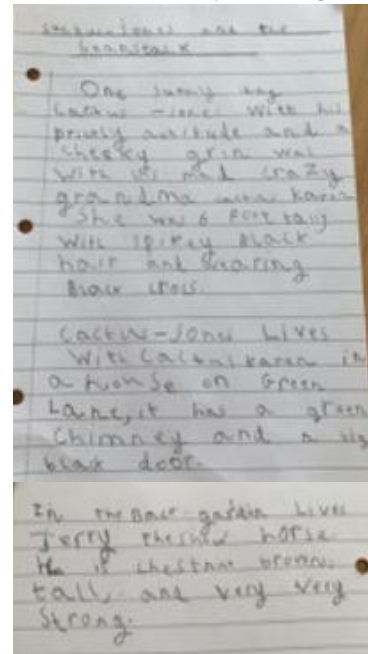

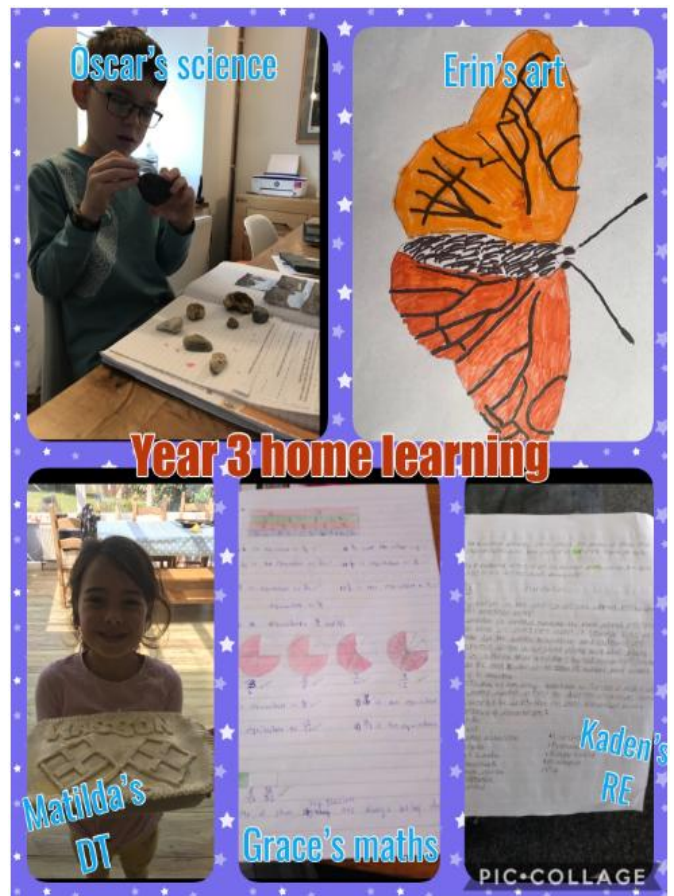


Year 3

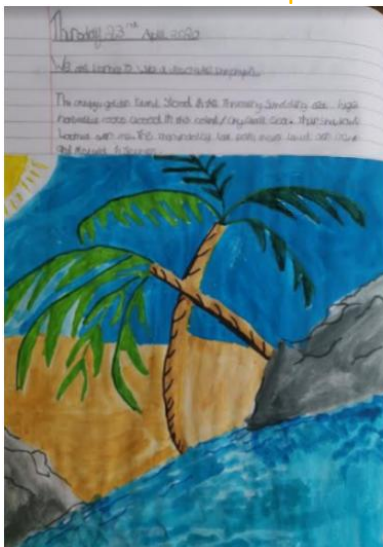

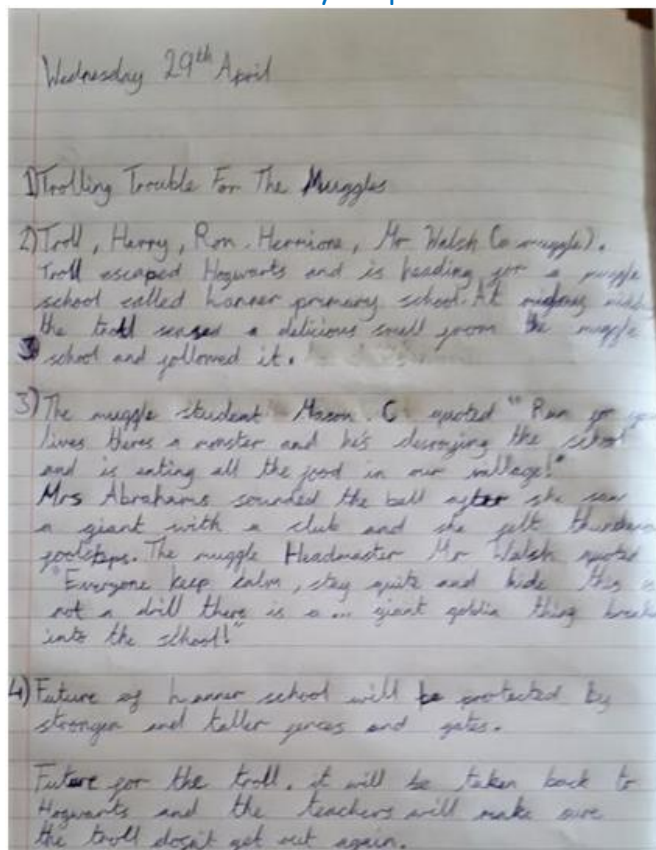


Year 6
