St Piran's Day - Thursday 5th March

World Book Day - Friday 6th March

Please be advised of the arrangements for St Piran's Day and World Book Day. As you may be aware, both days fall on the same day this year (5th March), so we have decided to split the two days. However, we are conscious that this can be an inconvenience for parents so we have tried to make these days as low impact as possible - whilst at the same time making sure we mark these very important occasions. So, the plan is as follows:
