1:1 and small group TA support for pupils	To close the gap between identified pupils and their peers. To provide social and emotional support.	Academically the gap to narrow between pupil and peers. Learning Mentor support	To provide ongoing Learning Mentor time for pupils experiencing social and emotional upsets/family trauma to address social and emotional difficulties that cause barriers to learning.	Pupils to be more emotionally secure and therefore more settled in class and be able to make progress with their learning.	Pupils able to focus on learning as they are happy and confident to be in school. They have good emotional wellbeing and are able to deal with friendship issues or difficulties quickly.
Additional resourcing	To purchase reading resources to enable learners to access the curriculum at their own level and boost rates of progress.	Accelerated progress. Raised levels of confidence.	Good progress shown in reading confidence and accuracy. Reading for pleasure demonstrated more often.
Provide access to extra-curricular clubs and visits.	To provide financial assistance for clubs and trips to ensure that they have opportunities to socialise with peers and raise their self-esteem	Pupils have opportunities to socialise with peers, represent school in competitions and improve skills. Pupils have increased self-esteem.	Pupils able to access a range of after school activities, to socialise with friends and develop skills across a broad spectrum of activities.
