

What 'remote learning' can I expect from Woodfield Primary School?

This information is to be used as a general guide. Parents will receive further details of remote learning for their child as and when it is required. We aim to implement remote learning from your child's second day of absence. There are 2 general scenarios outlined below; the first scenario where your child is not permitted to attend school and the second outlines the actions in the case of a whole bubble not being permitted to attend school.

Circumstance	Remote learning
<p>My child (and their siblings if they are also attending Woodfield Primary) is absent because they are awaiting test results and our household is required to self-isolate. The rest of their school bubble are attending school and being taught as normal.</p>	<p>Children will receive a paper-based learning pack along with a letter from the teacher detailing the information required. This can be printed and delivered by the school or emailed to you. All completed work should preferably be photographed and then uploaded to Class Dojo for your classteacher to comment. The lessons will follow the daily timetable and comprise of the following.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Maths lessons - will follow White Rose, the same as in the classroom • English lessons - this will follow the same objectives as in the classroom • RWI sessions/phonics for KS1 - to work on the sounds your child will be missing • Reading - it will be expected that your child reads each day. We can arrange for reading books to be changed if needed. • Topic task(s) - following the lessons being covered in class that week. If the lessons being taught in class are not able to be delivered remotely (e.g. if it requires additional resources such as art resources e.g. clay or pastels, or geography resources e.g. maps and atlases) then alternative 'topic' learning will be set or the teacher may make use of the Government's 'Oak Academy' lessons.
<p>My child's whole bubble is not permitted to attend school because they, or another member of their bubble, have tested positive for Covid-19.</p> <p>We enter a local 'lockdown' with total school closure.</p>	<p>Teachers will deliver all sessions on Microsoft Teams. It is expected that all children will attend all sessions. Morning sessions will include a registration/welcome session, Maths and English session. Afternoon sessions may include independent learning or online sessions. Work should be completed and marked online. Where this is not possible, school will provide packs of learning. These should be photographed and uploaded to Class Dojo so the teacher can comment.</p> <p>Nursery and Foundation will only use Class Dojo for all their learning.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Maths lessons- scheduled on Microsoft Teams, following on/mirroring the maths being covered in the classroom at that time. Answers will be provided for self-marking at home. • English tasks – scheduled on Microsoft Teams following the sequence of learning happening in the classroom. The quantity will be dependent on age/stage of your child. This will include spelling, grammar, writing and reading. • RWI sessions/phonics for KS1 - to work on the sounds your child will be missing. • Reading - it will be expected that your child reads each day. We can arrange for reading books to be changed if needed. • Topic task(s) - will be uploaded to Microsoft Teams for children to complete and hand in virtually. These will be the lessons your child would have had in class this term, which can be most easily adapted to remote learning.
