I hope everyone has had a lovely, restful Easter break. The following newsletter is a brief summary of the content for the Summer Term.

Please note that Year 3 children will not be part of the choir for the Year 6 production in the Big Top this year; with the growing numbers of children in Key Stage 2, it is not possible to have everyone in the Big Top.

We are lucky enough to have two forest schools days in the coming weeks. If you would like to help for all, or part of, either day please let me know. All volunteers will be much appreciated and the more help we have, the more activities we can run.

P.E. - this term, the children will usually be doing outdoor P.E. on a Friday each week. This may change from week to week, so please ensure that children's PE kits are brought in on a Monday morning and remain in school all week. All kit must be clearly named, long hair must be tied back and earrings must be removed for PE sessions. Children should have P.E. shirts

and shorts, outdoor shoes, long trousers and jumper or tracksuit for outdoors in their PE kits.

Swimming lessons will take place on a Wednesday and Thursday each week. The children will need swimming costumes/shorts/trunks, towel, underwear (particularly if they've worn their swimming costumes under their clothes in the morning!) and, if hair is longer than shoulder length, a swim hat. If children would like to wear goggles then please can you provide a signed note to accompany these. If your child has a verruca, please ensure they have a verruca sock to wear. These can be purchased from our local pharmacy. Other useful items include deodorant (no sprays), talcum powder and a hairbrush. Please ensure your child does not have any gel in their hair on a swim day as it affects the chemical levels in the pool. Please ensure that children do not have sun cream on before they are due to go in to the pool. We will swim rain or shine so remember a hat or raincoat for children to wear at the side of the pool. We are lucky enough to be supported in our Wednesday swimming sessions by Mrs Treadwell, a qualified swimming instructor.

Homework:

- Reading logs - please ensure you listen to, or monitor, your child reading three times per week and this is signed and dated. This will form an important part of my assessment for reading, and is a key dialogue between home and school. Reading logs will be collected in every Monday but should be in school every day.
- Weekly spellings - these will be sent home on a Tuesday and tested the following Tuesday.
- Homework - your child should have already received a homework grid for this term, and it has been great to see some beautiful pieces of homework already. If you haven't got one or need a replacement, please don't hesitate to ask. Please sign homework books weekly and indicate how much help/where help has been given or if it was simply too easy! This will really help me to gauge the children's understanding.

Theme for the term - The Romans

Our topic for this term will be The Romans. We will be learning all about who the Romans were, myths and legends, gods and goddesses, invasion of Britain and their way of life. As part of our learning, we will be going on a trip to Fishbourne Roman Palace on Friday 6th July. A separate letter with more information will be sent out in the coming weeks.

Numeracy - Work will always be differentiated to suit the needs of the child.

Science - For the first half of the term, the focus will be on plants; we will be learning about the different parts of plants, what they need to live and planting some of our own plants. We will then move on to light and will investigate how light is reflected and how different shadows can be formed.

Computing - Our unit this term is programming. We'll be learning how to program using software in different ways.

R.E. - Our first unit will be based around The Kingdom of God. We will be learning about the story of Pentecost, understanding Christians' beliefs about Jesus and the Holy Spirit, and learning about Jesus' followers. We will then move on to learning about People of God.

Art - we are looking forward to Art Week in the second half of this term when we will be creating some individual and whole class pieces of work based around different artists.

Music - we will be focusing on The Class Orchestra and will be creating a radio programme complete with songs for a children's hospital radio show.

D&T - we will be looking at different forms of packaging and creating our own nets of a particular item of packaging.

History - this will be covered by Miss Bell on a Thursday and will be centred around our topic on The Romans.

We would love to hear from any parents who would be willing to give up a little bit of time to help with children's reading in our class. If you could hear children read, please let me know.
