# PE and Sport Premium for Primary Schools

The DfE are spending over £450 million on improving physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools over the 3 academic years 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016. We will allocate this extra funding directly to primary headteachers.

Schools can choose how they use the funding, for example to:

- hire specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers during PE lessons
  - support and involve the least active children by running after-school sports clubs and holiday clubs.
  - provide resources and training courses in PE and sport for teachers
  - run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the School Games.
  - run sports activities with other schools
  - Hire qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers when teaching PE
  - Provide cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE
  - Run sport competitions, or increase participation in the School Games (a national competition)
  - Provide places for pupils on after-school sports clubs and holiday clubs

... how well the school uses the new primary school sport funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.
