Dear Parent/Carer,

St Paul's would like to invite all pupils to participate in the Royal Mail's national art competition, honouring the heroes of the coronavirus pandemic, and the children will come home today with an official competition entry form to submit their designs.

Eight pupils from primary and secondary schools across the UK will become designers, and one of them could be your child!

Royal Mail is asking children to think of the heroes who have continued to work tirelessly to keep the country moving during the pandemic and to keep us all safe. Some design ideas could be NHS frontline workers, school teachers/support staff, supermarket workers, delivery drivers, public transport workers, vaccine scientists, food bank volunteers, cleaners or military personnel - maybe Captain Sir Tom Moore.

The winning designs will be sent to Her Majesty The Queen, before they are printed and issued.

In addition to the eight winning stamps, the winners will receive up to £1000 in high street vouchers and our school will receive up to £1000 in cash, plus 120 great prizes on offer for regional winners and runners up.

If your child would like to take part, all competition entries **must be returned to school by Monday 24th May** to allow us time to post them to Royal Mail by their competition deadline.
