ParentPay Login Details - All pupils new to the school were given ParentPay login letters last week. If anyone else needs one please ask in the office.

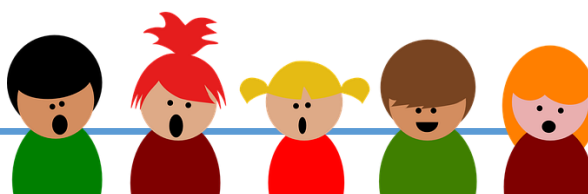
Cornwall County Choirs—Mini Singers
