PLASTIC BOTTLE TOP UPDATE



Unfortunately, our plastic bottle top collection has now come to an end. The children have shown a huge interest and responsibility in trying to help tackle ocean plastic pollution by collecting as many plastic bottle tops as possible, therefore reducing the amount of plastic reaching our oceans.

This project has also been successful in making us all aware of the amount of plastic we use, and potentially could throw away without recycling, consequently polluting the oceans around us and harming wildlife.

Over the next week, the children in each class will count and sort their collected bottle tops and they will submit their totals to Mr Orton and Miss Drury, who will reveal the winning class before half term. The winning class will win an afternoon at Brocks Hill Country Park, which will involve walking to the park, enjoying a single-use plastic free picnic together, and playing on the equipment. This reward supports our home learning initiative as it involves physical activity, time outside and time spent together.

Once counted and submitted, all of the bottle tops will be used to create a visual display in school promoting the message of 'Keep our sea plastic free' (please see the image above).
