All the guests were very impressed with the children and how the school participates within the Prince William Award.

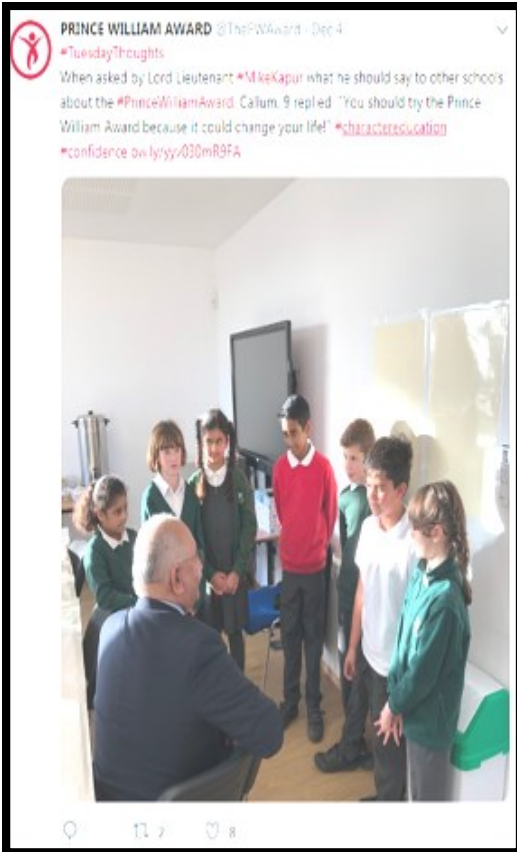
Well done to all the children for making the guests feel very welcome.
