This week...

We are learning 4 new graphemes - ay, ou, ie, ea

Here are some example of words containing these graphemes. Your child could have a go at putting the sound buttons on and reading them, try to think of more words to add to the lists (or look for some in books) and once they are confident reading the words they could try spelling them too.

ay	ou	ie	ea
'y' can act as a vowel, making the 'a' say its name (long vowel sound).	The short 'ow' sound is also made using 'ou'. This is usually in the middle of a word or before 'nd'.	When two vowels go out walking the first one does the talking, so 'ie' makes a long 'i' sound.	When two vowels go out walking the first one does the talking (makes a long vowel sound).
