Free apps:

Maths alien adventure- is designed to help promote and develop core mathematical skills. In particular it focuses on: doubling, number bonds to 20, sequencing and odd / even numbers.

Pizza Fractions Lite- this app helps children start to recognise fractions and the amount they represent.

Number Lines- this is an interactive number line which children can use at home to help them.
