Privacy Notice for Parents/Carers (How we use your child's personal information)

Under data protection law, individuals have a right to be informed about how the school uses personal data that we hold about them. We comply with this right by providing 'privacy notices' to individuals where we are processing their personal data. This privacy notice explains how we collect, store and use personal data about pupils. We, Shirley Community Primary School, are the 'data controller' for the purposes of data protection law. Our data protection officer is Ian Hoare (see 'Contact Us' below).

The categories of pupil information that we collect, hold and share include:

- Personal information (such as name, unique pupil number and address)
- Characteristics (such as ethnicity, religion, language, nationality, country of birth and free school meal eligibility)
- Attendance information (such as sessions attended, number of absences and absence reasons)
- Assessment and curricular information
- Relevant medical information
- Special Education Needs information
- Exclusions/behavioural information
- Photos, films and CCTV images
- Details of any support received, including care packages, plans and support providers
- Safeguarding information
- Personal information about a pupil's parents and/or other relatives (such as name, contact details, relationship to child)
- We may also hold data about pupils that we have received from other organisations, including other schools, local authorities and the Department for Education

Why we collect and use this information

We use the pupil data:

- to support pupil learning
- to monitor and report on pupil progress
- to provide appropriate pastoral care
- to administer admissions
- to assess the quality of our services
- to comply with the law regarding data sharing
- to share data for statutory inspections and audit purposes

to keep pupils safe
to ensure we observe cultural and religious beliefs

The lawful basis on which we use this information

We collect and use pupil information under

- The Education Act (various years)
- The Education (Pupil Registration) (England) Regulations
- The School Standards and Framework Act 1998
- The School Admissions Regulations 2012
- Children and Families Act 2014
- The Special Educational Needs and Disability Regulations 2014
- Article 6, and Article 9 (GDPR) – from 25 May 2018 (includes special category data)

Collecting pupil information

Whilst the majority of pupil information you provide to us is mandatory, some of it is provided to us on a voluntary basis. In order to comply with the General Data Protection Regulation, we will inform you whether you are required to provide certain pupil information to us or if you have a choice in this.

Storing pupil data

We hold pupil data for varying lengths of time depending on what the information is. Further information on the retention of data will be published on our website from June 2018.

Who we share pupil information with

We routinely share pupil information with:

- schools that the pupils attend after leaving us
- the Department for Education (DfE)
- Parents and representatives
- Educators and exam boards (STA)
- Our regulator (OFSTED)
- Health authorities (NHS)
- Health and social welfare organisations (social care)
- our local authority (Cambridgeshire County Council)

- Agencies we commission to deliver services on our behalf (for example, Cambridgeshire Music Agency and Premier Education)
- Professional advisers and consultants
- Other agencies working to improve a pupil's education and/or wellbeing such as:

- Police forces, courts, tribunals

Why we share pupil information

We do not share information about our pupils with anyone without consent unless the law and our policies allow us to do so.

We share pupils' data with the Department for Education (DfE) on a statutory basis. This data sharing underpins school funding and educational attainment policy and monitoring.

We are required to share information about our pupils with our local authority (LA) and the Department for Education (DfE) under section 3 of The Education (Information About Individual Pupils) (England) Regulations 2013.

Data collection requirements:

The National Pupil Database (NPD)

The NPD is owned and managed by the Department for Education and contains information about pupils in schools in England. It provides invaluable evidence on educational performance to inform independent research, as well as studies commissioned by the Department. It is held in electronic format for statistical purposes. This information is securely collected from a range of sources including schools, local authorities and awarding bodies.

We are required by law, to provide information about our pupils to the DfE as part of statutory data collections such as the school census and early years' census. Some of this information is then stored in the NPD. The law that allows this is the Education (Information About Individual Pupils) (England) Regulations 2013.

The department may share information about our pupils from the NPD with third parties who promote the education or well-being of children in England by:

- conducting research or analysis
- producing statistics
- providing information, advice or guidance

The Department has robust processes in place to ensure the confidentiality of our data is maintained and there are stringent controls in place regarding access and use of the data. Decisions on whether DfE releases data to third parties are subject to a strict approval process and based on a detailed assessment of:

- who is requesting the data
- the purpose for which it is required

the level and sensitivity of data requested: and
the arrangements in place to store and handle the data

To be granted access to pupil information, organisations must comply with strict terms and conditions covering the confidentiality and handling of the data, security arrangements and retention and use of the data.

Requesting access to your child's personal data

Under data protection legislation, parents and pupils have the right to request access to information about them that we hold. To make a request for your personal information, or be given access to your child's educational record, contact Jo Bouttell, School Business Manager or Ian Hoare, Data Protection Officer, both of whom can be contacted by email at office@shirley.cambs.sch.uk

You also have the right to:

- object to processing of personal data that is likely to cause, or is causing, damage or distress
- prevent processing for the purpose of direct marketing
- object to decisions being taken by automated means
- in certain circumstances, have inaccurate personal data rectified, blocked, erased or destroyed; and
- claim compensation for damages caused by a breach of the Data Protection regulations
