Share some stories

Collect up some soft toys and do a puppet show together using the toys, you can make up a story or act out a traditional tale like 'Little red riding hood' or Goldilocks and the three bears.'

Sing some songs and rhymes

This week's rhyme is called 'What do dinosaurs eat?' You can find it on our home learning page on the school website.

Can you make up your own rhyme about a dinosaur? Or maybe you can do some body percussion e.g. stamp your feet, clap your hands, tap your knees to make a rhythm.

Get Messy

Make some gloop. Use a washing up bowl, 2 cups of cornflour, 1 cup of water and if you have food dye you can add 2 drops of it in too. Explore the mixture in the bowl and see how it feels on your hands. What words can you think of to describe it? Fill a bowl with some children's shampoo or shower gel and use a whisk to create some bubbles, then hide some plastic milk bottle tops or any other objects you have in the bubbles and to try to find them.

Do some colour sorting

Find a big piece of white paper and some colour pens or pencils, then draw nine lines going down to the end of the paper to create eight columns. At the top of each column draw a square and then colour the square in with the different colours that you have. Then gather some trains or cars and line them up in the different columns according to the colour at the top. Here is a picture of one to help you. Have fun sorting!



Make a dinosaur landscape

Have a go at creating a landscape for dinosaurs. You will need some toilet roll inner tubes, coloured paper, coloured pens/pencils, a large piece of cardboard and some glue. First make some trees using the toilet roll tubes as a trunk and then cutting strips of green paper to make the leaves to stick on to the tubes. Then make a volcano by drawing its shape onto the cardboard and using coloured pen/pencils to create the lava coming out of the top. Next you can scrunch up bits of paper coloured in grey to make rocks. Have fun creating it!
