Share some stories

This week's story is called 'Eat Your Peas' and it's a fun story about a little girl who doesn't want to eat her peas. Here is the link for the story. <https://video.link/w/mn0Nb>

Can you share a story that you have at home together and talk about what is happening, what might happen next, and how the story might end?

Sing some songs and rhymes

This week's rhyme is called 'once there was a dinosaur, you can find it on Pre-schools home learning page on the website.

Try practising rhyming with your child. Say the rhyme together, and then say it again leaving out the rhyming words and seeing if they can put them in.

Make patterns

Make some patterns with Lego. Cut some paper in to strips and draw some squares in a line on to the strips. Then let your child colour them in different colours and see if they can build up the lego according to the order of the coloured squares.



Practice counting /Explore shapes of dinosaurs

Can you look at some dinosaurs and explore their colours, shapes and sizes. Have a go at drawing some and then compare them to see how different they look.

Look around the house for the same amount of different items e.g. Can they find 3 socks, 3 dolls, and 3 cars. Then see if they can count how many there are altogether.

Get experimenting

Make a volcanic eruption! Can you do an experiment to see what happens? You will need a bottle, a funnel, some food colouring, bicarbonate of soda and some water. Here is a video showing you how to do it. Have fun experimenting! <https://www.bbc.co.uk/cbeebies/makes/nina-and-the-neurons-volcano>.

Create dinosaur mud! All you need is a washing up bowl or plastic tub, 2 cups of cornflour, 1 cup of cocoa powder, 1 cup of water and a spoon. Mix them all together with the spoon and when the mixture resembles mud add some dinosaurs to play in the mud!
