



Guyhirn Church of England Primary School Sport Premium Impact Report 2020-2021

For the academic year 2020-2021 the school will receive approximately £16720 in sport premium funding to spend on School PE and sport. The funding has two main aims:

- To develop and add to the PE provision and curriculum already in place in our school.
- To make sustainable improvements now and for the future.

The National Curriculum aims are:

- Children to be physically active throughout the school day.
- Children to participate and experience a range of PE and sports activities
- Children to engage in competition
- Children to lead Healthy Lifestyles

Guyhirn Church of England Primary School will use the premium to secure improvements in the following 5 key indicators.

Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity, for example by:

- providing targeted activities or support to involve and encourage the least active children
- encouraging active play during break times and lunchtimes
- establishing, extending or funding attendance of school sport clubs and activities and holiday clubs, or broadening the variety offered
- adopting an active mile initiative
- raising attainment in primary school swimming to meet requirements of the national curriculum before the end of key stage 2. Every child should leave primary school able to swim

Guyhirn Church of England Primary School is located in a small village in the Rural Fenland area and sporting opportunities are minimal.

Guyhirn Church of England Primary School aspires to ensure all children have the opportunity and means to participate in high quality sport provision within, and in addition to the curriculum.

The Sports premium funding has been prioritised in the following areas to ensure a positive impact on the school community.

- To improve provision through membership with Improve it Sports partnership to include affiliation, competitions, Staff professional development and provision of high quality coaching staff.
- To maintain and extend free high quality sports clubs, available to all the pupils.
- To provide dance classes, available to all pupils.
- To provide transport to and from the local swimming pool for all pupils to attend swimming lessons in curriculum time from reception year,
- To hire both pools at the local swimming pool to meet the needs of varying swimming ability from Reception year.
- To improve staff knowledge and confidence in varying aspects of the PE curriculum.
- To improve parental involvement of physical education
- To promote our school values through class team building days.
- To develop early years foundation stage physical development through training in the use of balance bikes.
- To provide inspiration, aspiration and resilience to all.

The effect of the funding on Pupil's sport participation and attainment

- Participation at intra sports competitions have increased
- 38% of children currently attend additional after school sports club
- 67% of children have attended additional after school sports club
- Through continued consistent PE provision attainment in PE skills has shown a significant improvement particularly in confidence.
