What has happened to the other trees around it?</p> <p>Task: Sentence challenge A preposition is a word that shows the relationship between one thing and another.</p> <p>It may tell you where a thing is in relation to something else. E.g. The green, shining door appeared inside the tree.</p> <p>It may tell you when something is in relation to another event. E.g. The portal would not close until the electrical storm had ended.</p>			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In the first sentence sum up what the story is about. • Write your report in the third person and the past tense. • Split your newspaper report up into paragraphs to help the reader clearly understand the information. • If you use quotes to make your report more interesting, don't forget to use speech marks! • Use a photo with a caption to give the reader more information. • Fill your newspaper report with both facts and opinions. Facts give the reader all of the information they need by using the 5 Ws.




