| Premier Sport Provision of coach at lunchtime to promote and supervise football and other sports. | £40 x 5 = £200 x 38 weeks = £7,600 | High level of physical activity during lunch time with a goal of improving behaviour due to proper supervision and refereeing of football games for upper ks2. 2 after school clubs per week benefitting 40 children. | Behaviour continued to improve throughout the year during lunch times and Premier Sport offered a variety of other activities through the summer months to keep a range of children engaged. Additionally, the coach supported the school with Sports Day and House football matches, increasing the quality of these events. 80 % of children in Year 5/6 say that they took part in an activity run by the Premier Sports coach (Harry Reynolds) last year. 100 % of these children say that they enjoyed this activity and it made them physically active during lunch time. They said that the coach was <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Fun - Good at teaching the skills of sport - Had similar interest to them - Motivating and enthusiastic - Helped them get active - Challenging - Fair, because he understood the rules |
| NCA sports festivals | £500 a year | Each year group participates in a sports festival at least once per year. Pupils introduced to different sports and experience competition with children from other schools. | All year groups from 1-6 were able to travel to NCA and receive a range of sporting experiences, including team work and competition. These were extremely well organised and ran by the NCA PE staff, utilising the skills of secondary students to run the activities. |
| Subscription to sports partnership | £1,100 | To continue providing our members of staff with training opportunities to improve their practice. The SSP offer a wide range of inter school tournaments which Shirley are taking part in such as; boys and girls football tournament, hockey tournament, cross country, gymnastics, kwik cricket. | The SSP offers training opportunities to members of staff, which was then fed back to colleagues during staff meetings. CPD was given to teachers regarding how to plan and teach an outstanding PE lesson, and how to plan and execute a lesson on Invasion Games. Additionally, Shirley entered boys and girls teams into a wide scale tournament against 16 other teams, a cross country competition, and a tournament for children with learning and physical disabilities, providing access to sport and physical activity for a wide range of pupils. |
| Cambridge Youth Games | £200 | A fantastic opportunity for year 4 to experience a sports tournament / festival against / with other schools in a wide range of sports and activities. | All children in Year 4 (60 pupils) attended a large scale, whole day event in which they competed as teams against other schools in a wide range of sports and activities. This event increased the opportunity for inter-school competition, increased engagement in physical activity through taster activities and introduced the less confident children to a Change4Life experience. |
| High quality specialist PE teaching from NCA - Ali Carrol | Remainder of sports allocation - £325 | Specialist PE teacher leading units of work in Year 4, covering PPA. 61 pupils in Year 4 accessing high quality PE sessions. CPD for Year 4 teachers to watch the teaching and delivery of high quality PE lessons. | All children in Year 4 received high quality PE teaching, enabling them to develop their physical fitness, team work and skills in a range of different sports. |

| Premier Sport Provision of coach at lunchtime to promote and supervise football and other sports. | $£40 \times 5 = £200 \times 38$ weeks = £7,600 | High level of physical activity during lunch time due to coach refereeing football games for Upper KS2. 2 after school clubs per week benefitting 40 children. |
| Premier Sport Provision of female sports coach at lunchtime in KS1 to increase level of physical activity | $£32.50 \times 5 =$ $£162.50 \times 32$ weeks = £5,200 | High level of physical activity during lunch time due to coach refereeing football games for KS1. The coach will then move to the KS2 playground for the final 15 minutes of their lunchtime with the goal of leading a short physical activity for children on the KS2 playground. |
| Premier Sport Provision of PE teacher two lunchtimes a week, and 2 afternoons a week (Monday and Wednesday) | $£40 \times 2$ (lunch) $£80 \times 2$ (afternoons) = $£240 \times 18$ weeks = £4,320 | A female coach to increase the amount of physical activity of girls during lunch time with dance/gymnastics/cheerleading activities on the stage. She will also run a lunch time dance club during the spring term to engage more girls in sport and physical activity. CPD for Year 3 and 4 class teachers in the teaching of dance and gymnastics, and the delivery of high quality dance and gymnastics lessons to all children in Year 3 and 4. |
| NCA sports festivals | £500 a year | Each year group participates in a sports festival at least once per year. Pupils introduced to different sports and experience competition with children from other schools. |
| Subscription to sports partnership | £850 | To continue providing our members of staff with training opportunities to improve their practice. The SSP offer a wide range of inter school tournaments which Shirley are taking part in such as; tag rugby tournament, netball tournament, cross country, gymnastics, kwik cricket. The SSP also provide activities for children who may not otherwise access sports activities e.g. children with learning and physical disabilities, children with low confidence etc. |
| Cambridge Youth Games | £200 | A fantastic opportunity for Year 4 to experience a sports tournament / festival against / with other schools in a wide range of sports and activities. |
| Travel to sports inter-school sports competitions organised by School Sports Partnership (SSP) by coach, taxi etc. | Remainder of sports allocation - £780 | Engage more children in competitive sports, and provide opportunity to compete against other schools in a wide range of inter school competitions, including cross country, High 5s netball, tag rugby and gymnastics. |
