<p>Statement about the effect of the expenditure on the educational attainment of those pupils who were eligible for pupil premium</p>	<p>The school will evaluate the impact on pupils eligible for Pupil Premium each term. Evaluation will focus on academic gains and how pupils' self-confidence develops as a consequence of the intervention.</p>

Outcomes	<p><u>2017/18:</u></p> <p>Year 1 Phonics Check</p> <p>4 Year 1 children completed the Year 1 Phonics Check.</p> <p>75% of the children passed their Year 1 Phonics Check.</p> <p>The one child who did not reach the expected standard on the test made good progress throughout the year when the children were tested on their progress.</p> <p>1 child retook the Phonics Screening Check as a Year 2 but wasn't present during the testing week but had reached 'expected standard' when tested in March.</p> <p><u>End of Key Stage 1 achievement</u></p> <p>9 children completed the end of Key Stage 1 tests.</p> <p>78% reached the expected standard in Reading.</p> <p>22% achieved greater depth in Reading.</p> <p>67% reached the expected standard in Writing.</p> <p>11% achieved greater depth in Writing</p> <p>89% reached the expected standard in Maths.</p> <p>33% achieved greater depth in Maths</p> <p>56% reached the expected standard in Reading, Writing & Maths.</p> <p>11% achieved greater depth in Reading, Writing & Maths.</p> <p><u>End of Key Stage 2 achievement</u></p> <p>9 children completed the end of Key Stage 2 tests.</p> <p>55% reached the expected standard in Reading.</p> <p>44% reached the expected standard in Writing.</p> <p>44% reached the expected standard in Maths.</p> <p>33% reached the expected standard in Reading, Writing & Maths.</p> <p>44% reached the expected standard in Grammar, Punctuation & Spelling</p> <p>11% achieved greater depth in Reading & Grammar, Punctuation & Spelling</p>
