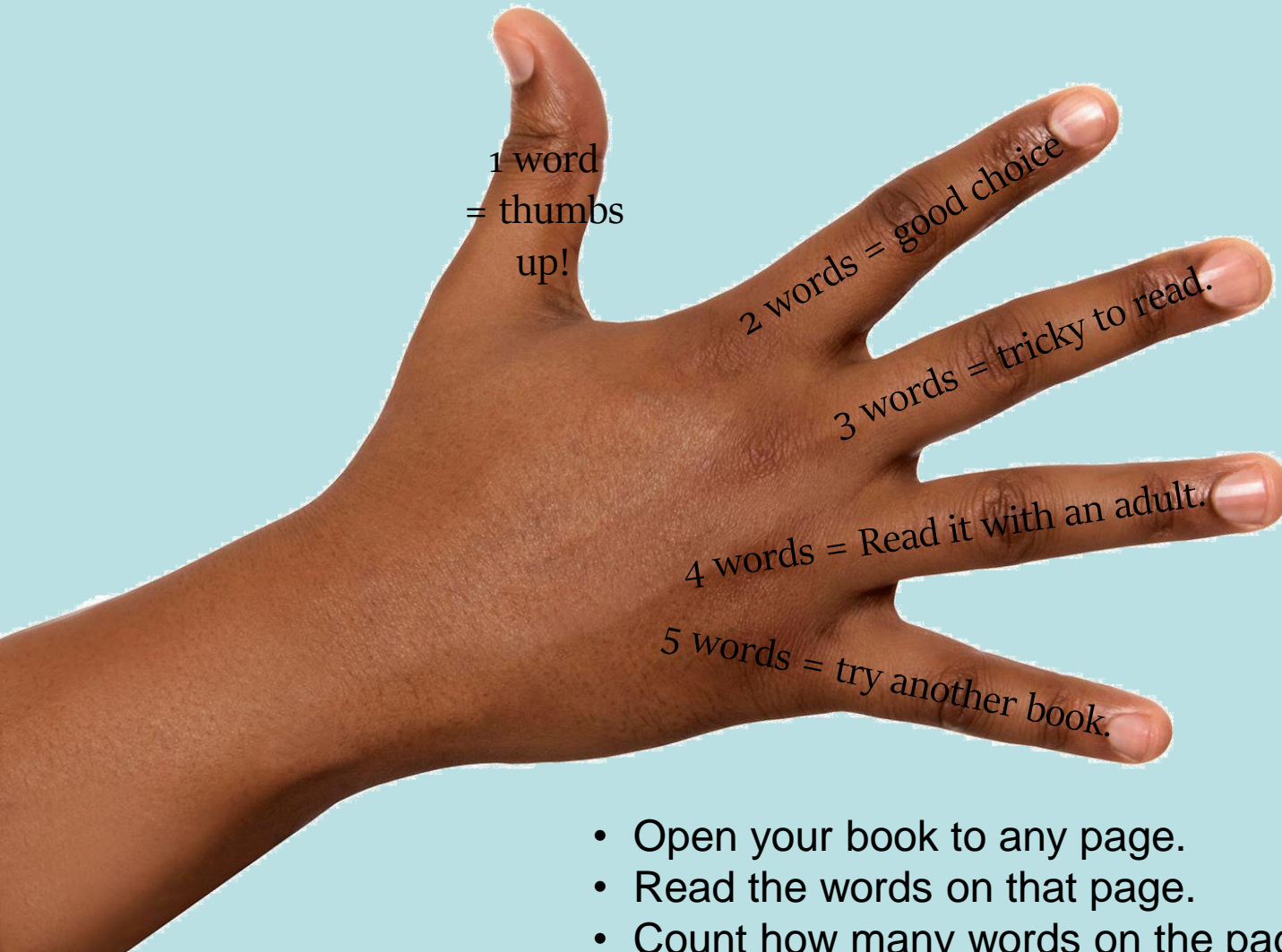
90% accuracy
