Improving and providing outstanding education for children in the local area- Preschool focus

We have continued our focus on providing excellent education for local children by focusing on some of the youngest members of our community.

- Governors and senior leaders took on the task of looking at Early Years provision in Meldreth and the surrounding area and the ways in which we could support continued high-quality provision and provide further stability.
- As a result, we voted to encompass the pre-school into Meldreth Primary, as you will have seen from our Newsletter and [school website](#).

Even in the midst of a crisis, our school takes opportunities to grow. We believe this will enhance the provision; ensuring the village not only maintains the important presence of a Preschool, but also that our school raises attainment for our early years pupils and provides a more fluid transition into school for children.

Governor recruitment


From the Chair...
