
Book Bags

Please ensure your child brings in their book bag **every day** so that letters and pieces of work reach you safely. This also means that your child is encouraged to read daily and change their reading book regularly. To support their independence, we ask that they put their book bag in their tray in the classroom when they arrive in the morning.

PE Sessions

Beech- P.E days are Tuesday (Mrs Johnston) and Wednesday
Pine- P.E days are Monday and Tuesday (Mr Green)

To help your child with these sessions please ensure they wear clothes that enable them to dress and undress themselves **independently**. Please ensure their clothes are **clearly named** to help us match up any left-over clothes at the end of the session. No earrings on P.E. days please. If children have newly pierced ears, please provide microporous tape so that the earrings can be covered.



To follow in our whole school policy, all children need practical indoor and outdoor shoes, ideally with hard soles in case of a fire drill.

Lost Property:

Please make sure that all items of clothing are **named**. Any lost items we find in class will be put in the red wooden box in the hall.

Homework:

Children will receive a homework book which includes a spelling, English (handwriting) and maths activity for each week detailed on the half-termly homework menu. Homework will be sent out on Fridays and will be due in on the following Wednesday. Spellings will be tested each Friday. Please practise regularly during the week.

Home School Journals

New journals for the Autumn term will be sent home with your child's reading book. Please write the reading book's title, tick when the book has been read (ideally at least three times a week) and write a small comment about your child's reading. We are launching an exciting, whole-school 40 Book Challenge; more details to follow soon!

Home School Journals are also a good form of communication between home and school, if you are unable to come in and speak to your child's teacher. **Please can we ask that any Home School Journals are checked regularly and any with messages be handed directly to the teacher in the morning.** All Home School Journals will be checked and signed weekly to monitor the children's reading and communicate directly with parents.



Autumn/winter weather

As we progress through the Autumn term, the weather will undoubtedly become chilly, wet and windy. Please make sure that your child has a **named** coat and pair of wellies or appropriate outdoor shoes in school so that they are prepared for any eventuality.


Show and Tell:

We love hearing the children talk about their learning outside of school and Show and Tell provides children with an opportunity to improve their speaking and listening skills and share things they find or do related to our topic this half-term, which is Under the Sea. The show and tell timetable for this term will be sent home separately.

Please can children only bring in Show and Tell items on their named day.

Reading books

Children will be able to change their book in the mornings before lessons begin and we are trying to encourage the children to be as independent as possible in doing this. If they are frequently bringing the same book home, please remind your child as you drop them off in the morning and also let us know so we can remind them to change it too! We will routinely assess children's decoding, fluency and comprehension skills to determine when they are ready to move to the next book band but please do talk to your child's teacher if you have any queries regarding their reading progress. We also encourage children to visit the library weekly where they can choose an additional book to enjoy. Library club will be on Thursday lunchtime.

Morning and Afternoon Routines:

We encourage children to enter the classroom through the cloakroom independently at the start of the day. There will be a morning activity waiting for them to complete in the classroom. The class teacher will be available to speak to parents at the door if you have an urgent message, but due to time constraints ask that you make an appointment after school should you wish to talk more in-depth regarding your child.

To ensure that children leave the school safely and teachers are aware of whom they have left with, we will call the children individually in the cloakroom to meet their adult. Please could adults collecting children identify themselves at the end of the day to help us get to know you at the start of term!

If your child is being picked up by a different adult, please inform your class teacher or the school office ahead of time as they will not be allowed to leave at the end of the day with a different adult without your consent.
