

## PE and Sport Premium Funding - Bottisham Primary School – July 2013 – July 2014

The government is spending over £450 million on improving physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools over the 3 academic years 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016. This extra funding is allocated directly to primary headteachers.

Schools can choose how they use the funding, for example to:

- hire specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers during PE lessons
- support and involve the least active children by running after-school sports clubs and holiday clubs, e.g. the [Change4Life](#) clubs
- provide resources and training courses in PE and sport for teachers
- run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the [School Games](#)
- run sports activities with other schools

School will be held accountable by requiring them to publish by April 2014, on their websites, details of how they spend (or will spend) their PE and sport grant. They must also include detail about the impact this funding has on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment.

Bottisham Primary is being allocated £8900 for 180 pupils in 2013-2014 with £5442 allocated in December and £3458 in May. We intend to spend the money on ensuring that we can provide more extra-curricular opportunities for all pupils, to develop CPD as identified by staff, participate in and organise inter and intra-school competitions and ensure we are well resourced for PE lessons.
