Spare Clothes



Please may I remind you to make sure that your child always has a complete change of clothes in school. Spare clothes bags should be left at school, in a bag on your child's peg. During the autumn term there will be lots of messy and outside play available for the children and it is very important that your child has clothes to change into when necessary. **Please ensure all clothes and other personal belongings are clearly named.**
