Safeguarding and pupil well being

Children feel safe in school. This is evidenced by a pupil questionnaire and by members of the LGB talking to children at different points throughout the year.

The governor with responsibility for safeguarding meets regularly with the Headteacher to ensure the school is compliant and addressing any issues as and when necessary.

A third member of SLT has recently been trained as a designated person.

Pupil attainment and progress

Governors are pleased with the progress made by the children. The results are detailed further in the notes of our recent DRV.

Year 6 results were above national figures across the board which was extremely pleasing for all those involved with the school.

Financial Management

The budget has been monitored regularly by the Finance Estates and Personnel committee. The budget has run on track over the course of the year and it is anticipated that savings can be achieved by the end of the financial year.

Governors have been made aware of the financial position in the years going forward. Careful management and cost cutting where possible will need to be undertaken due to large cuts in school budgets.

Church of England religious character and Christian distinctiveness

The school works hard to ensure the school has a strong Christian ethos and that this is evident to all those who come into the school.

Stronger links have been made with the church and the local vicar leads collective worship at least once a month. Christmas and Year 6 leaver's services have been held in the church as well as other year groups visiting the church for a number of reasons.

The school was visited by a vicar from another parish earlier in the year. He spent a week in the school and it was a valuable experience for him and the school. The school are hoping to be part of this project again next year.

Children have started to lead Collective worship once a week under the support of the head teacher. This has been successful in raising self-esteem and confidence as well as ensuring the children are fully involved in collective worship.
