Pupils showed an improvement in wellbeing, mental health and behaviour self regulation.	
Pupils who are Pupil Premium should have targeted Teaching Assistant support to provide early intervention, effective feedback on learning, support with metacognition and self-regulation, small group tuition, one to one tuition, social and emotional support, Lego therapy and Sensory Circuits.	£21,090 (£6628 +£14,462)	Teaching Assistant support Pupil Premium Champion support and guidance	Additional support for individual children through targeted use of Teaching Assistants. Pupil Premium children will reach ARE by end of KS2. Teaching Assistants and Pupil Premium Champion have Pupil Premium targets in Performance Management.
