# Onomatopoeia Answers

Accept any sensible answer, including but not limited to:

getting a paper cut	<b>wail, cried, groan</b>
door slamming	<b>thud, bang, crash, boom, crash, creak</b>
a fire engine	<b>nee-naw, screech, wail, revving</b>
sneezing	<b>atchoo!</b>
cow on a farm	<b>moo, groan, stomp</b>
kids playing games	<b>giggle, scream, screech, zoom, cry, shriek</b>
tearing paper	<b>rip, whizz, whoosh</b>
a baby chick	<b>chirp, cheep, chitter, cluck, squeak</b>
a horse galloping	<b>clack clack, thud thud, clip clop</b>
drinking water	<b>gulp, slurp, gurgle, slosh, splash</b>
strong winds	<b>howl, whistle, sing, cry, shriek</b>
football in a net	<b>whoosh, zoom, zipped, whizzed</b>
doorbell	<b>ding dong, chime, buzz</b>
