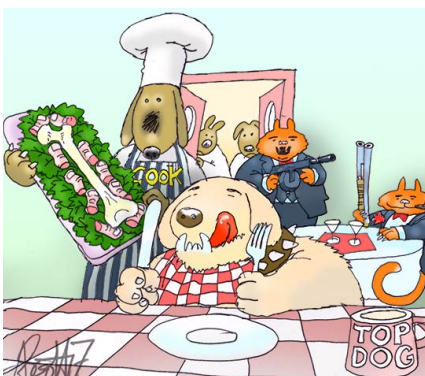

[SUMP-tu-ous]


adj. **large, lavish or splendid**

Like a royal banquet at Buckingham Palace.



