A daily lesson will be supplemented by tasks on Mathletics.	As above for KS1 and KS2. Home learning lesson plans and task to complete which as far as possible mirror the work that would have been done in school (this may not be possible for practical subjects). Lessons will include videos using Oak academy and/or BBC bitesize. EYFS learning will be accessed via the website learning platforms, Tapestry and class email.  Teachers must ensure the broad curriculum is covered over the course of the closure period. A least one foundation subject lesson a day with additional suggested activities eg daily exercise, research work, life skills etc.	As above re use of video lessons. A minimum of 3 hours curriculum KS1 and 4 hours KS2. All weekly home learning lessons timetables will be available to access from the Friday before the start of the week from the school website. One teacher from the year group will provide a Monday morning briefing outlining the learning for the week that will be on the website. Weekly pastoral chats will take place with class teacher. A half termly phone call will be made to parents should the school closure last for more than 3 weeks. Google classroom and the learning platform will be used for pupils to communicate with their teachers during school hours. Teachers will monitor completed tasks and provide feedback regularly through the learning platform or Google Classroom (as a minimum at least twice a week each for Maths and English, and at least one a week for other subjects)
