

**SCHEME OF WORK COVERAGE – ART AND DESIGN**  
**Milestone One – Key Stage One (Reception, Years 1 and 2)**

To develop ideas	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Respond to ideas and starting points</li> <li>• Explore ideas and collect visual information</li> <li>• Explore different methods and materials as ideas develop</li> </ul>
To master techniques <b>Drawing</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Draw lines of different sizes and thickness</li> <li>• Colour (own work) neatly following the lines</li> <li>• Show pattern and texture by adding dots and lines</li> <li>• Show different tones by using coloured pencils</li> </ul>
To master techniques <b>Painting</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use thick and thin brushes</li> <li>• Mix primary colours to make secondary</li> <li>• Add white to colours to make tints and black to colours to make tones</li> <li>• Create colour wheels</li> </ul>
To master techniques <b>Collage</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use a combination of materials that are cut, torn and glued</li> <li>• Sort and arrange materials</li> <li>• Mix materials to create texture</li> </ul>
To master techniques <b>Sculpture</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use a combination of shapes</li> <li>• Include lines and texture</li> <li>• Use rolled up paper, straws, paper, card and clay as materials</li> <li>• Use techniques such as rolling, cutting, moulding and carving</li> </ul>
To master techniques <b>Print</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use repeating or overlapping shapes</li> <li>• Mimic print from the environment (e.g. wallpapers)</li> <li>• Use objects to create prints (e.g. fruit, vegetables or sponges)</li> <li>• Press, roll, rub and stamp to make prints</li> </ul>
To master techniques <b>Textiles</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use weaving to create a pattern</li> <li>• Join materials using glue and/or a stitch</li> <li>• Use plaiting</li> <li>• Use dip dye techniques</li> </ul>
To master techniques Digital media	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use a wide range of tools to create different textures, lines, tones, colours and shapes</li> </ul>
To take inspiration from the greats (classic and modern)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Describe the work of notable artists, artisans and designers</li> <li>• Use some of the ideas of artists studied to create pieces</li> </ul>
