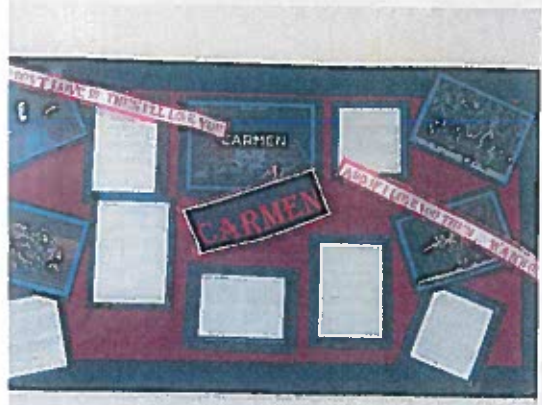




THOMAS EATON TRIUMPHS

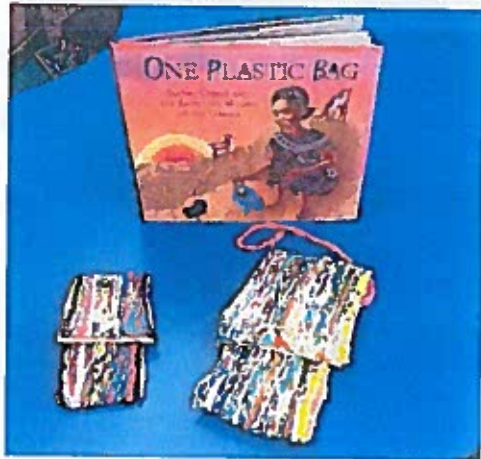

Early in the Spring Term our youngest children visited Church Farm where they spent a wonderful day looking at the animals and learning about our environment

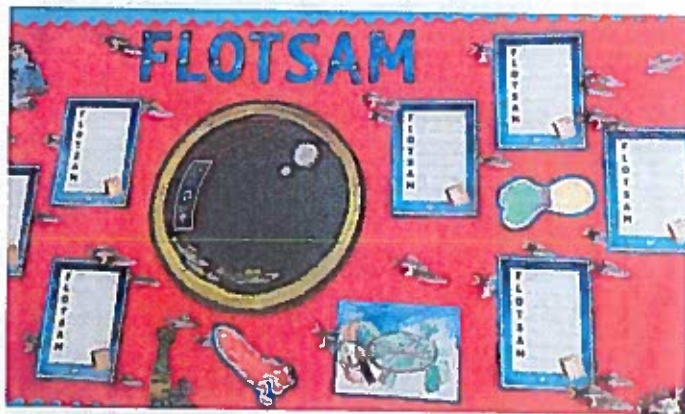
