

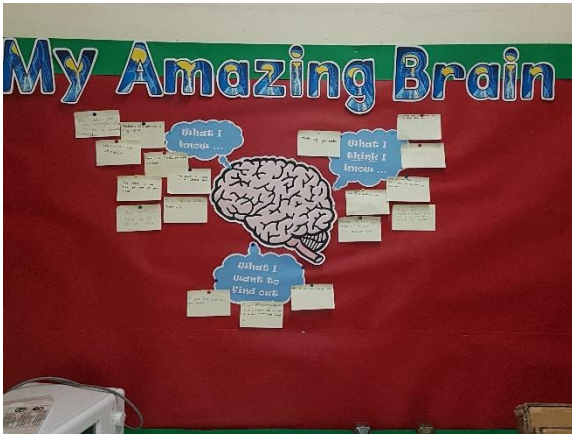


Dear Parents / Carers
