<p><u>Create an animal</u></p> <p>Use natural objects to design your own animal. Collect leaves, twigs, grass or stones to do this. Now name the animal?</p> 	<p><u>Bubbles</u></p> <p>On a windy day, it is great to go outside and blow bubbles. Make your bubble mixture by mixing washing-up liquid with water (about 4tbsp to one cup of water). To make a bubble wand, try using a slotted spoon, cookie cutters or funnel.</p> 	<p><u>'Bring Me' game</u></p> <p>Working in teams, the children bring items the adult requests. For example, Bring me:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • evidence of autumn • something natural • something that makes a noise <p>The quickest team to bring the item wins a point.</p> 
<p><u>I like to Move It!</u></p> <p>How many different ways can you move around your outdoor area? Can you walk? Hop? Jump? Skip? How about rolling? Challenge an adult to have a go too.</p> 	<p><u>Count the Catches</u></p> <p>Working with a partner, throw a ball to each other and catch. Each time the ball is caught, count each catch. When the ball is dropped stop counting and start again. Who can count to the largest number? Can you count forwards? Can you count backwards? Can you count in multiples of 2,5 or 10?</p> 	<p><u>Leaf Rubbing</u></p> <p>You will need:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A crayon • Some dry leaves <p>What to do:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Put a leaf under this sheet. 2. Rub the crayon on the paper on top of the leaf. 3. Watch your leaf rubbing appear on the paper. 
<p><u>Obstacle Course</u></p> <p>Design your own Autumn themed obstacle course in your garden. Can you jump into a pile of leaves or slide into some mud?</p> <p>Have fun.</p> 	<p><u>Soak the sounds</u></p> <p>Draw six sounds on the concrete or wall outside using chalk and get an adult to callout the sound from the wall. Use a water gun or cup of water to soak the sound that they say. Can you think of a word that has the sound in them?</p> 	<p><u>Animal Habitat</u></p> <p>Have a go at making some suitable homes for different animals in different places. Try making a home for a bird in a tree or a home on the ground for a hedgehog. Take some photographs of your creations.</p> 
	<p><u>Stick build challenge</u></p> <p>What can you build with sticks? Let your imagination run wild – the structure might be small or tall, sparse or detailed, one idea or a collaboration. Remember to take a photo of your creation and email it to your teacher. Have fun!</p>
