Amendments to the new Summer Menu starting after Easter

Changes to Free School Meals

For families on or going on to Universal Credit as from 1st April 2018 the new Income Threshold will be **£7,400 net (take home pay)**. This change means **more** low-income working families will be entitled. E-Safety warning – online game currently popular with children

You may have already heard of an online game called 'Fortnite'. It is a free-to-play online, interactive game accessible on PlayStation, Xbox, Windows and Mac, which combines resource collecting and survival gun battles. Hundreds of strangers go head-to head in a gun battle until only one man or team is left standing. Fortnite is rated as PEGI 12 for frequent scenes of mild violence. A number of parents have noticed that playing the game can make their children cross or angry. This is common in a number of games but exacerbated in Fortnite because of the large number of competitors and because each player only has one life. Parents also need to be aware of the interactions between players, who can hear each other during the game, and the possible implications here. Finally, as with any game, parents should be aware of the amount of time spent playing; playing games until the early hours during the week is bound to have an adverse effect on children's readiness for school.
