#### **PE and Sport Premium**

Our vision at Oliver Goldsmith is for every child to develop transferable skills, experience physical education and sports that inspire and motivate them so that physical activity is enjoyed and becomes embedded as part of a healthy lifestyle.

Previous funding for PESP at OGPOS has been £10,100. See website for past action plans and impact analysis.

In 2017 -18 the PESP funding received is £19,560.

The school will measure the impact of the funding throughout the year through: observation of PE lessons in EYFS KS1 and KS2, pupil voice, staff skills audits, analysis of data to include attendance at clubs. A report to the governors will be made annually. The Governor with direct responsibility for PESP is Dennis Varcoe.

#### **Success Criteria for 2017/18**

- To continue to upskill class teachers in teaching and assessment of PE
- To monitor children's progress in PE
- Review PESP spending with a view to engage a Sports Technician to support in the delivery of PE lessons, look after equipment and provide further opportunities in the enrichment programme – this will depend upon confirmation of PESP funding arrangements.
- Increase the numbers of children participating in enrichment activities across a school week.
- Improve the playground environment with more children involved in structured activities increasing opportunities for physical activity
- The school is able to participate in more locally organised competitions.
